

Implementation—Restructuring

- Goal: Introduce a new membership process, meeting plan and structure, and new governance structure
- Elements:
 - Wind down current structure through several more meetings with more focused debriefing on engagement experience and development of engagement guidebook
 - Utilize a gap between the sunset of the existing structure and launch of a new structure to finalize and initiate the plan
 - Launch a new group based on a new membership process and with a meeting plan catered to that group







Intended Outcomes
